In the Admission procedure college strictly follows the Kannur University reservation policies. College offers training facility in the following optional subject with total intake of 55 seats divided among five optional subject.

All these facilities collectively create a robust educational environment, fostering both academic excellence and personal growth among our students.

CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

The applicants must be qualified in the BA/BSc/Degree examination (under the 10+2+3 pattern) with one main/core subject and two subsidiaries/complementary courses from this University as equillant there to. They should be qualified with atleast 50% marks in Bachelor's Degree (Science/Arts subjects)for part I+II+III together (common, core, complimentary and open courses) or part III (core and complimentary courses)

- 1. Candidates belonging to SC/ST need to secure a passing the Degree examination.
- 2. The candidates belonging to socially and educationally backward caste (SEBC) will be given a relaxation of 5% from the prescribed minimum marks.
- 3. The candidates belonging to other eligible candidates (OEC) will be given a relaxation of 5% from the prescribed minimum marks.

Admission procedures will be started after the declaration of degree examination results and shall be made through online Centralised Admission Process (CAP).

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The students are admonished to set example of a noble and dignified demeanor
- 2. They should practice good manner in the campus as well as in the society.
- 3. Students shall be clean and modest in their dress and appearance and behave with dignity and courtesy.
- 4. Students are not permitted to come late
- 5. No meeting or entertainment shall be organized without the permission of the Principal.
- 6. Students should remit the prescribed fees to college on time.
- 7. In case if a student at discontinue the course, he should remit the full amount of fees.
- 8. In case of misbehaviour the Principal shall have the power to impose the following punishments: fine of attendants, suspension and compulsory issue of T.C.
- 9. The course certificate for the University examination will not be granted to any student unless the Principal is satisfied with his/her conduct, progress in studies and attendants and behavior.
- 10. Students are forbidden from handling furniture items or laboratory equipments without the knowledge of the Principal or concerned staff members.
- 11. A fulfledged P.T.A. is to be formed during the lst day of the class.

LEAVE AND ATTENDANCE RULE

- Students are not permitted to absent themselves without leave. Application for leave in the prescribed form should be submitted sufficiently earlier, at least a day before it is to be availed of. It should be submitted to the Principal with the recommendation of the optional teacher concerned.
- 2. Absence without leave for part of the day and fully is regarded as absence for the day.
- Absence for five consecutive working days without informing, will be considered a sufficient reason for removal of one's name from the rolls.

- 4. Unauthorized absence is seriously dealt with.
- 5. Absence form the class tests, model examination and extra curricular activities without valid reason will be treated as breach of displace.
- 6. A student shall be considered to have satisfactory attendance to appear the examination if he/she attends not less than 80% of the total working days for theory classes and attends fully the practice teaching days.
- 7. No condonation will be there for lack of attendance of practice teaching.
- 8. Morning Section begin 9.45 am. Students shall assemble for prayer soon after the first bell, which is followed by thought for the day.
- 9. Class begin from 10.00 am to 1 pm. and the afternoon session is from 2 p.m. to 4.30 pm.
- 10. Students should be punctual and regular in class.
- 11. The total attendance of each student will be displayed on the notice board at the end of each semester.
- 12. For admission to the University examination, students should have:
 - a. The required attendance out of the total no of working days.
 - b. Attendall the demonstration and criticism class.
 - c. A satisfactory academic achievement and conduct in the college.
 - d. Completed the course of instruction and practical work to the satisfaction of the teachers and principal.
 - e. Attended all the examinations conducted by the college authorities.

LIBRARY AND READING ROOM

An elaborate library facility is provided in the college and a full time librarian is in the charge of library. The library and reading room remain open from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm on all working days. Students are allowed to take only a note book to the library. All other belonging shall be left at the entrance.

1. Students can borrow two books at a time on production of library card. The borrowed books can be retained for SEVEN days and

- a fine shall be levied in the case of books not returned on the due date.
- 2. Strict silence should be maintained in and around the library.
- 3. All the borrowed books should be returned two weeks before the final examination.
- 4. Borrowers shall replace the book incase of it is lost or damaged.
- 5. Sub lending of library books is not allowed.
- 6. Reference books and current issue of any periodical cannot be borrowed.
- 7. The Librarian may recall a book at any time even when the normal period of loan is not over.
- 8. Hall ticket shall be issued only after obtaining a NO-DUE CERTIFICATE from the librarian.

IDENTITY CARD

- All the students of the college shall keep with them the identity card with their recent passport size photograph attested by the Principal.
- 2. All payments, issue of certificates, scholarships etc. will be made only on the production of the identity card.
- 3. Identity card is valid for two years only.
- 4. The student should surrender the Identity card when he/she leaves the Institution.

SCHOOL INTERNSHIP

Internship program in Teacher Education is of great significance because it ensure the professional preparation of prospective teachers. It provides them a practical opportunity to develop true understanding of the teaching profession and future prospects of working conditions in that profession.

Objectives of Internship

- * Learns the skills to transact the subject matter in accordance with the accepted principles of learning and teaching and in true with the needs and interest of the children.
- Develop required skills to teach in an inclusive classroom.
- Use different activity based and stage specific learning methods and strategies in the class rooms.
- Incorporate the components of ICT in classroom transaction.
- Learn about school activities, scheme and programmes and their impact on children.
- * Utilize the community resources meaningful partnership between school and community.
- School Internship should be designed for interns to teach for 5 days per week for a minimum period of 16 weeks, including an initial phase of observing a regular classroom. The intern will necessarily have supervisory support from the faculty in the form of subject supervision, who may also be supported by general teachers. The intern will be required to develop unit plans for which she must choose and design appropriate activities. The minimum number of lessons to be delivered is 60 at two levels excluding physical and Health Education classes. If a student practices teaching at different levels (upper primary, middle level, secondary and senior secondary) during the internship period, the minimum number of lessons to be delivered in a level should not be less than 15. A record of these plans must be maintained.

PRACTICAL EXAMINATION

Practical examination will be conducted by External Examination Boards constituted by the University. The duration of examination in our college will be 3 days.

During practical examinations all students should take class in their concerned subject before the external examiners. Selected students has to attend a viva voice before the chairman of the Board of external examination.
