Personal anecdotes and success stories of individuals benefiting from inclusive practices.


Her engaging delivery and real-life examples left a lasting impression on the audience.

The need for critical thinking and ethical values in personal and professional life.


Prof. Pokker's engaging and thought-provoking session resonated deeply with the students, encouraging them to realize their potential as agents of change.

Preventive measures, including healthy eating, regular exercise, and avoiding tobacco and alcohol.


The role of early diagnosis in improving survival rates.

To promote awareness of linguistic and cultural diversity.


To emphasize the importance of mother language in education and communication.

To celebrate the achievements of the college and its students.


To provide a platform for students to display their talents through cultural activities.

To highlight the significance of water as a vital resource for life.


To discuss the challenges related to water scarcity and pollution.

To emphasize the importance of environmental sustainability.


To educate participants on ways to reduce environmental impact.

To highlight the significance of yoga in maintaining overall health.


To educate participants on various yoga practices that can be incorporated into daily life.

To recognize the contributions of statistics to the development of society.


To promote the understanding of statistical concepts among students.

To promote the understanding of nature conservation and its significance.


To inspire individuals to take active steps in preserving natural resources.

To remember the devastating impact of the Hiroshima bombing and honor the lives lost.


