
2. Symposium on NEP 3/1/2022

4. One day Tour 8/01/2022 At Kuruva dweep




8. World cancer day 04/02/2022



52. Symposium- National education policy- Dr.CV Jayasree 1/3/2022




54. Art and Drama Workshop by Biju Neduvaloor 11/3/2022




56. Workshop on GeoGebra 14/03/2022


57. How to acquire language skills- a class on easy English by Shankarn Master 1/4/2022




61. FDP on Personality test and Calculations- Dr. Shivarajan Sir, 11/4/2022

to bridge resource gaps in local schools. The event highlighted the college's dedication to fostering educational development in the region.


64. Environmental day celebration 5/6/2022




67. Blood donation day 14/06/2022




71 Orientation class on SET – Shincy Mohan 11/6/2022

73. Student service holding hands 29/6/2022 Shanthi deepam Visit






78. Mr. Sumeshan P, Moon Day celebration Lecture 21/07/2022


79. International lunar day 22/07/2022


80. Interactive session on Copying up skills 27/07/2022- George Joshep


83. Professional ethics of teacher-workshop FDP VIjyan chalod 01/08/2022


84. Hiroshima day 06/08/2022 and Nagasakki day 09/08/2022




86. Teacher's day 05/09/2022

87. Onam Celebration 2/9/2022



90. Self-defense training 26/09/2022






92.Gandhi Jayanthi celebration on 2nd 2022


92. Food day 16/10/2022


94. Refreshment program on mental health and leadership 09/10/2022 Mr.Krishnakumar EP




97. Orientation class on KTET- By alumni Smruthi P on 9/11/2022



100. Diabetic day 14/11/2022




101. Children's day celebration 14/11/2022




103. Two-day Study Tour 04/12/2022 Mysore –
