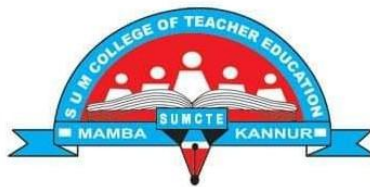

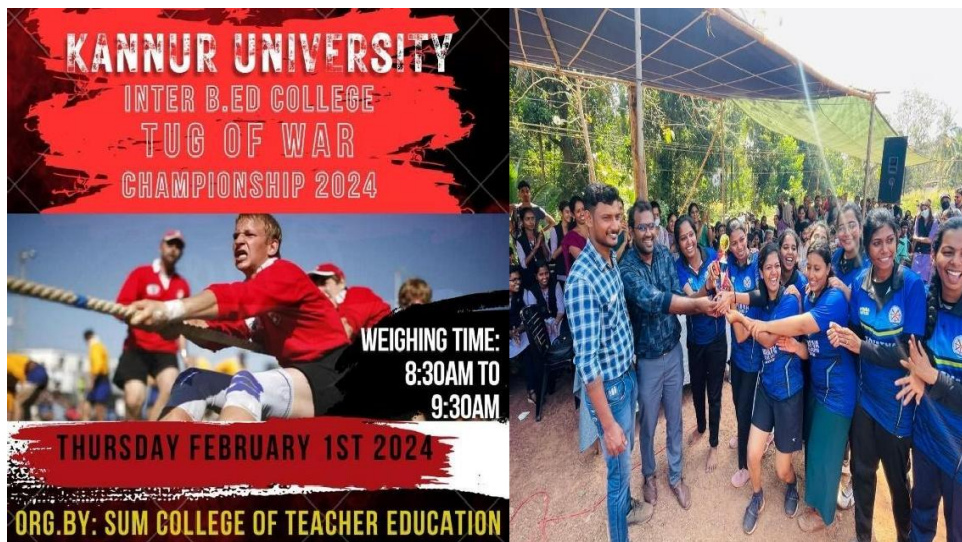


3. Inter B.Ed Tug of war championship

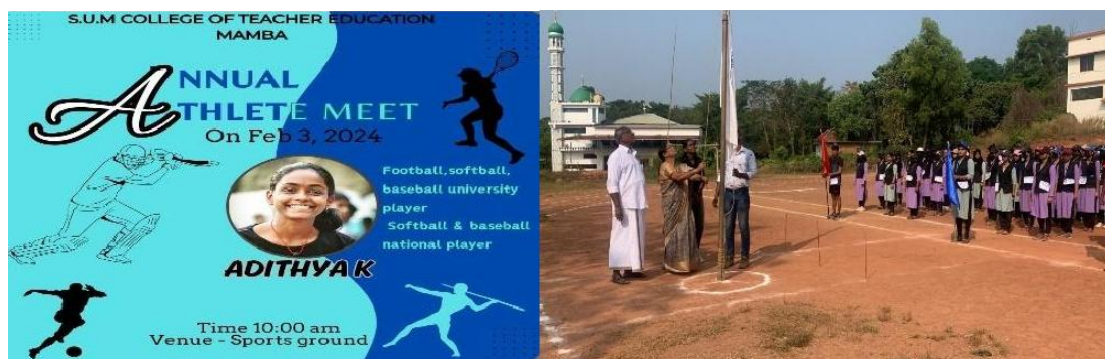


4. Annual Athlete meet

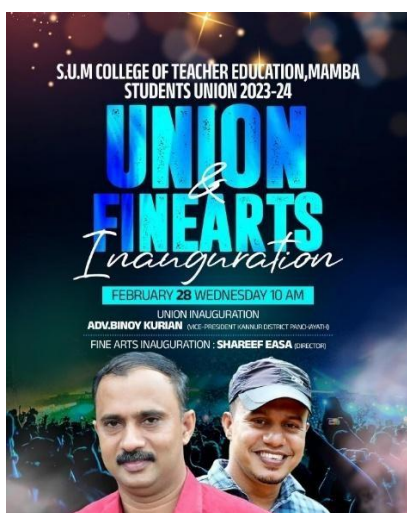


5. Fine arts Inauguration

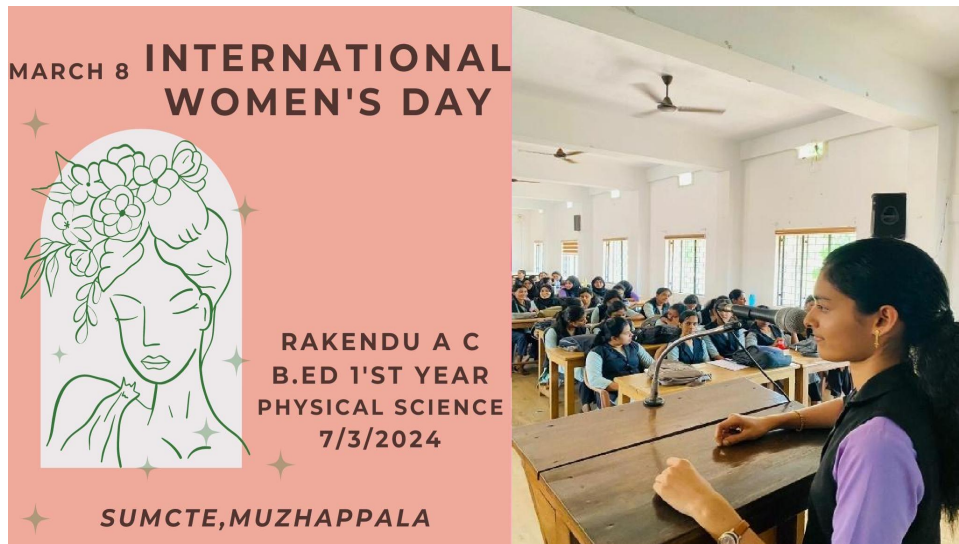


7. International women' s day

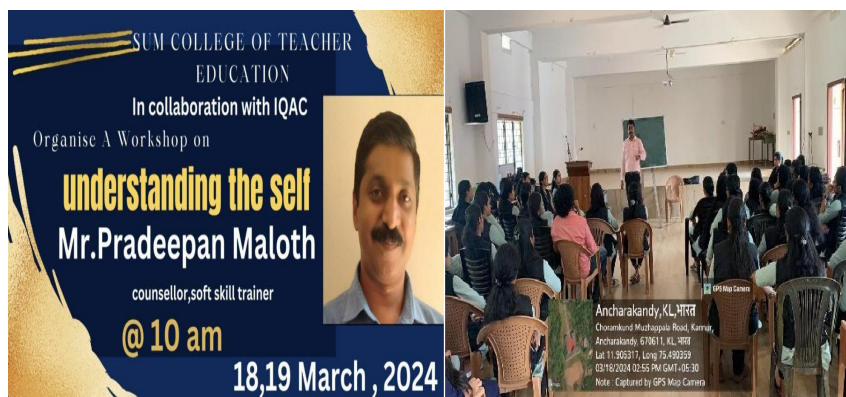


8. Two day workshop on understanding self

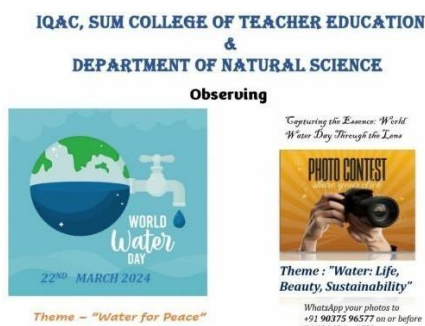


9. World water day observation

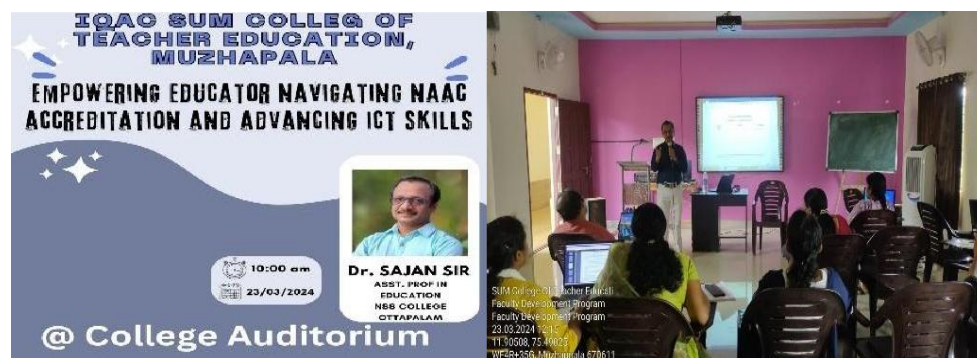


10. Empowering educator navigating NAAC accreditation and advancing ICT skills

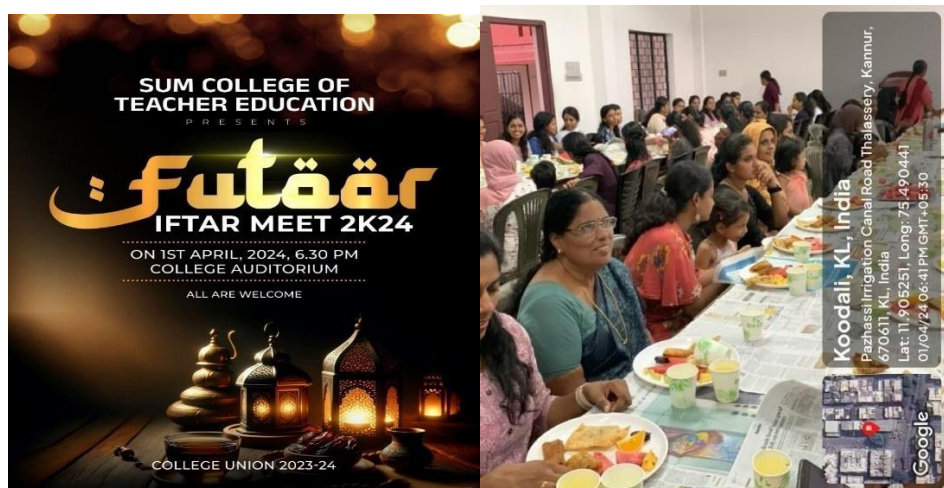
13. Iftar meet Date:

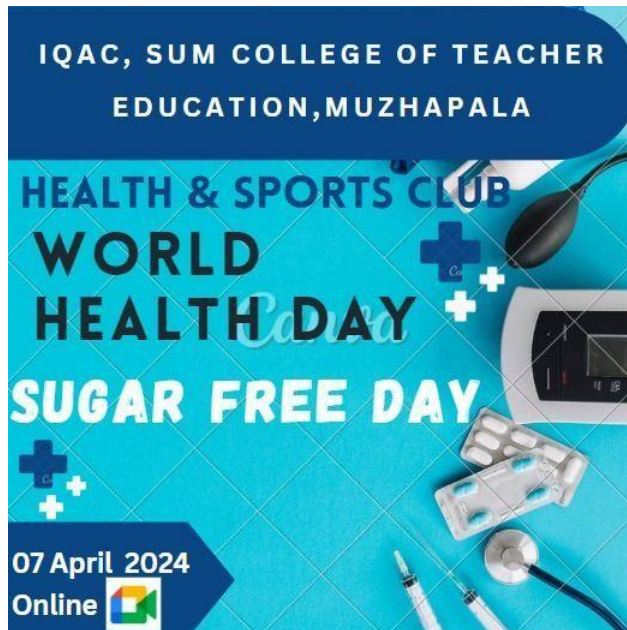


14. World health day

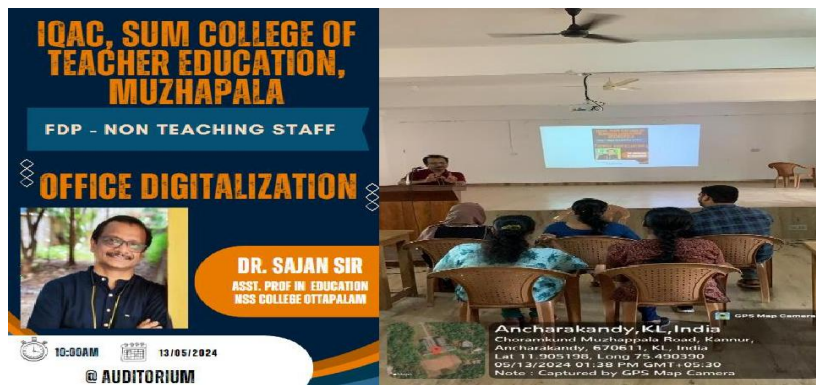


16. Office digitalization

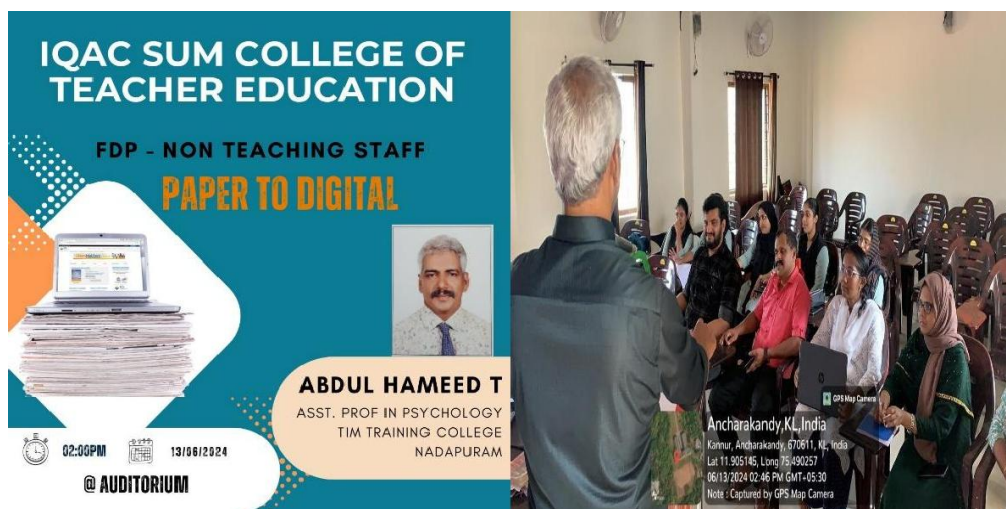
19. Paper to digital

Key topics covered included:

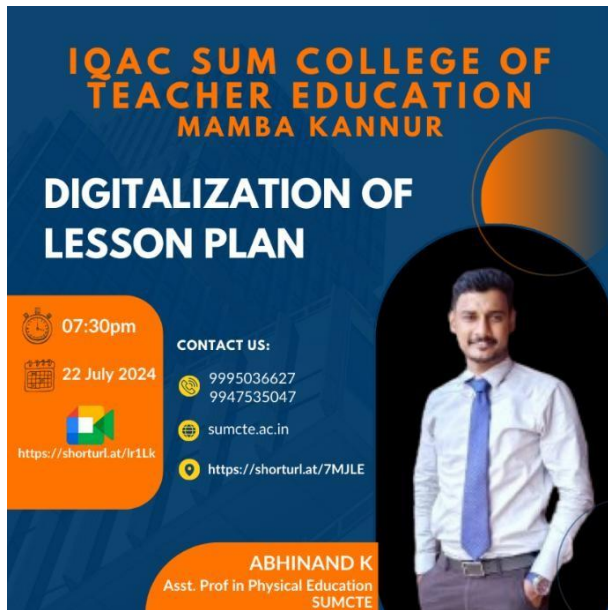
The importance of digital lesson planning in modern education.

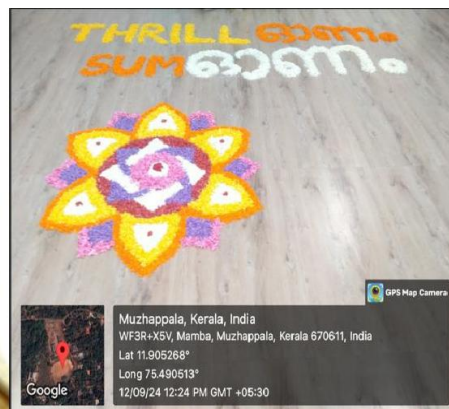
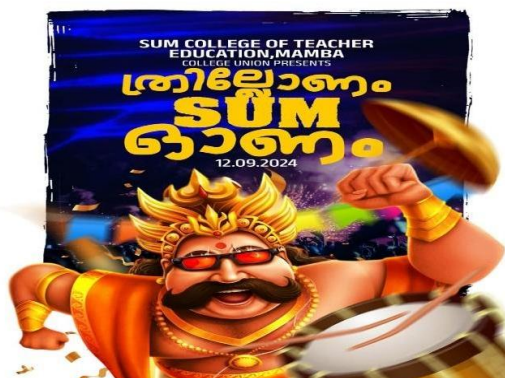

43. International Day of Older Peoples 2024

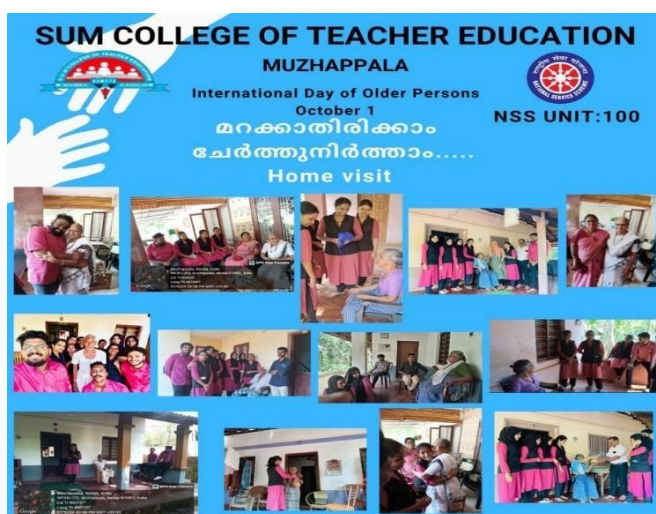

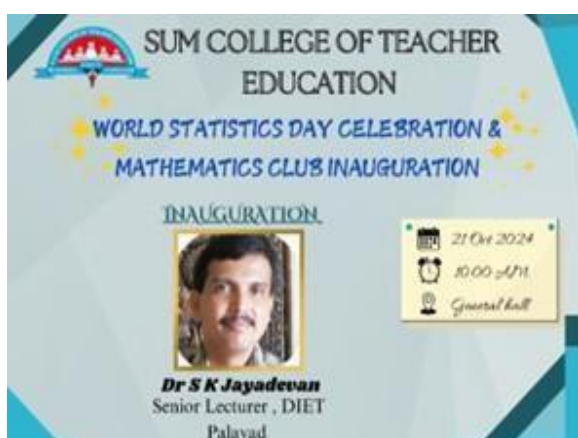


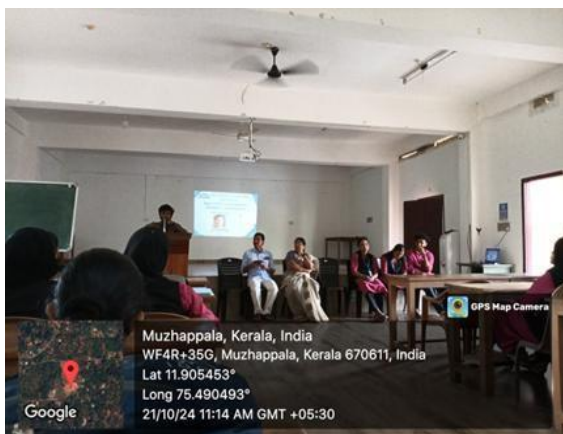
50. World statistics day celebration and Mathematics Club inauguration

51. Fire and safety demonstration session

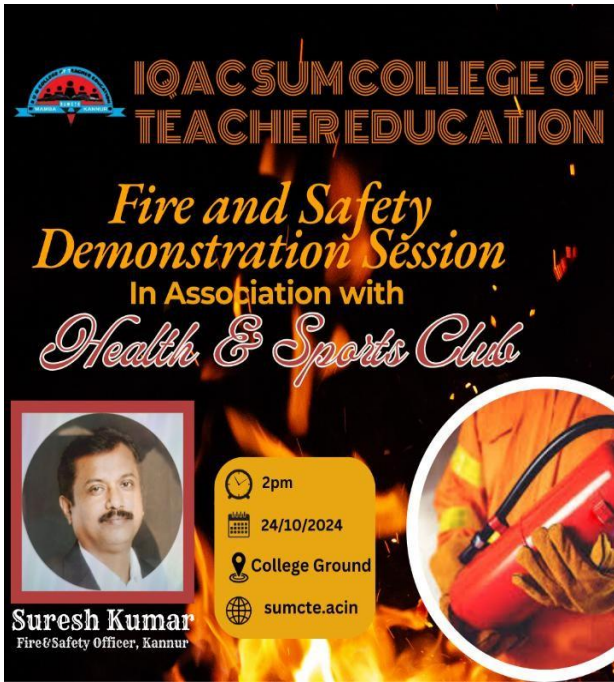

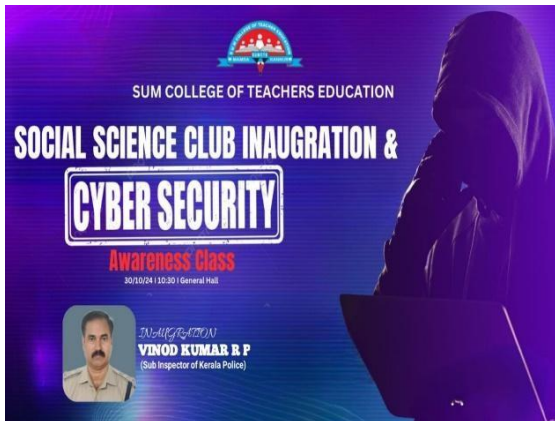


53. Social science club inauguration and Cyber security awareness session

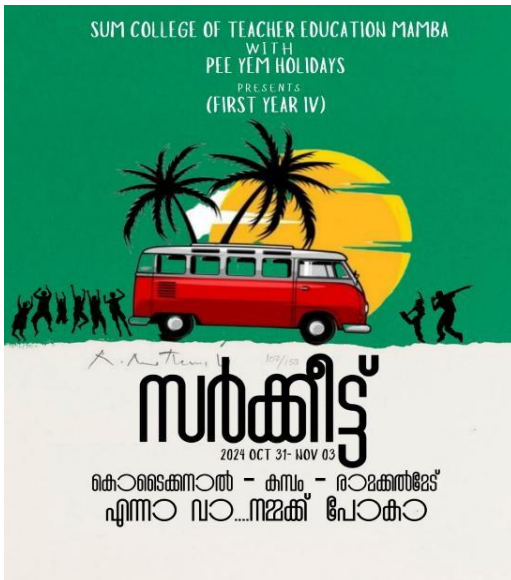


54. Study tour

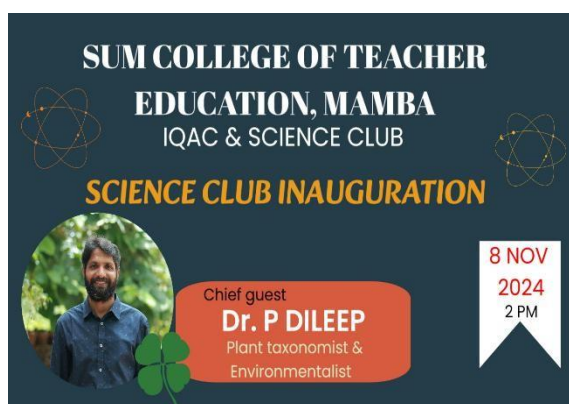


56. Science club inauguration

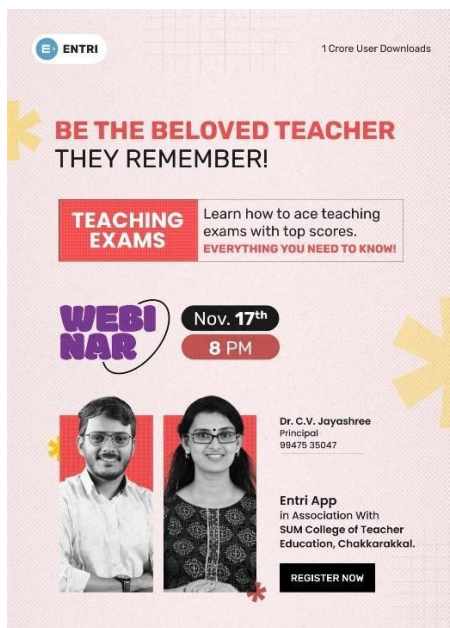

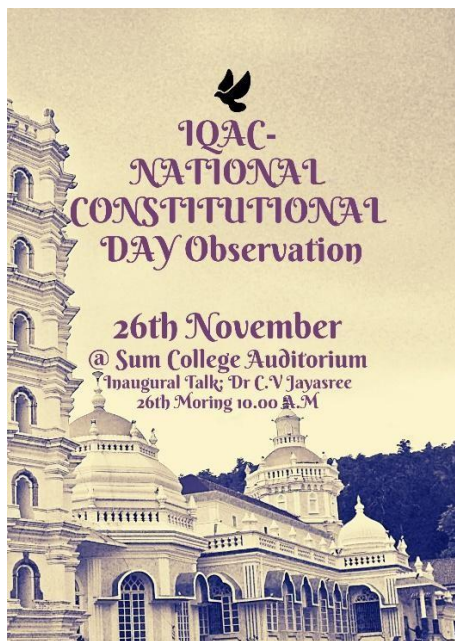


65. National constitutional Day Observation

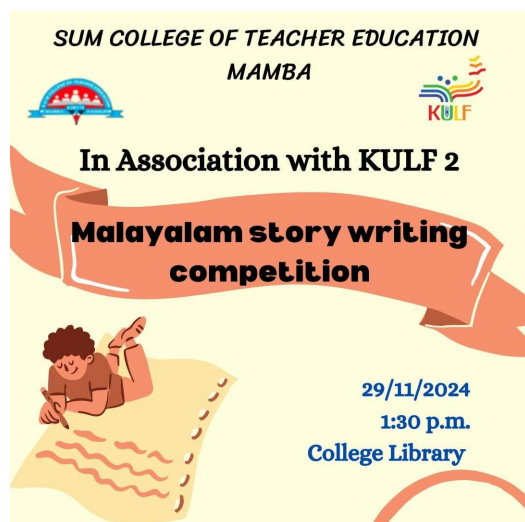


68. Malayalam story writing competition in association with KULF 2

Through this project, teacher trainees worked closely with these institutions, equipping students with adaptive skills essential for their personal and academic growth.



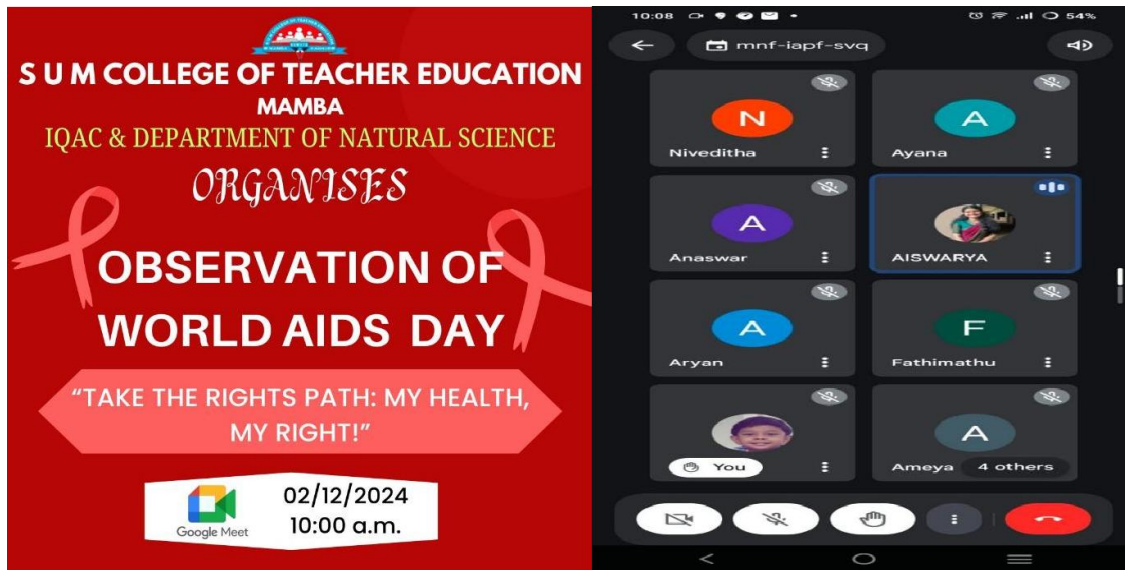
70. Observation of world AIDS day (online)

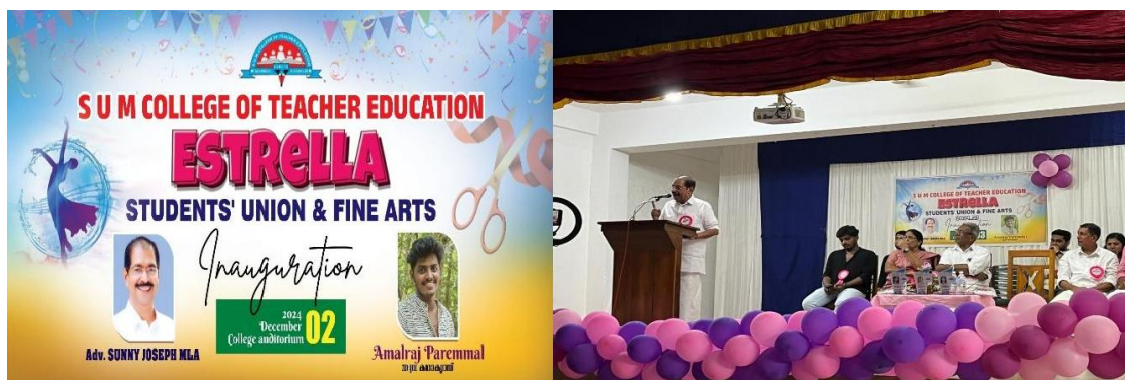


71. Union and Fine Arts inauguration

72. Observation of national pollution control day (online)

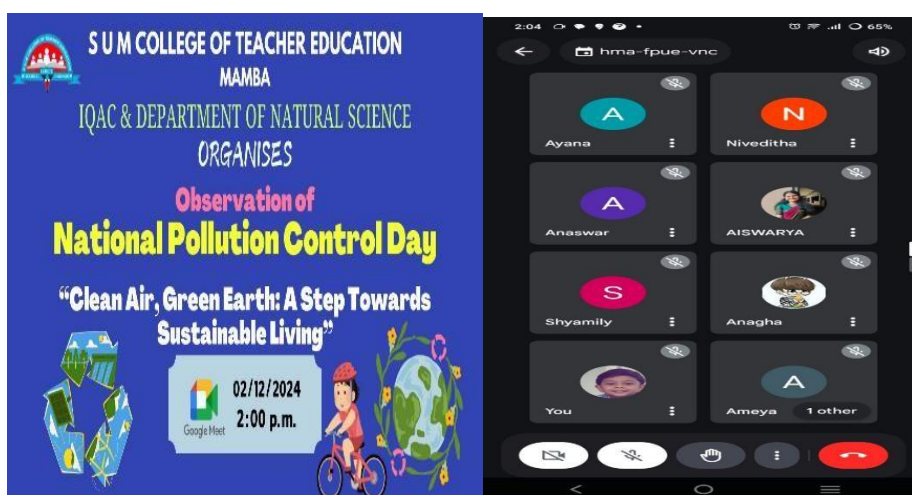

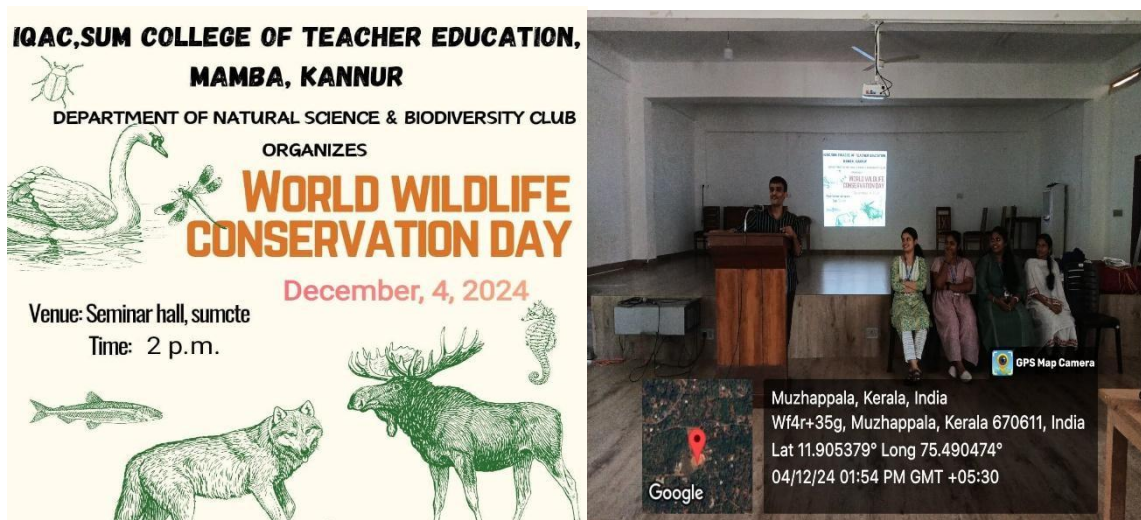


73. World wildlife conservation Day

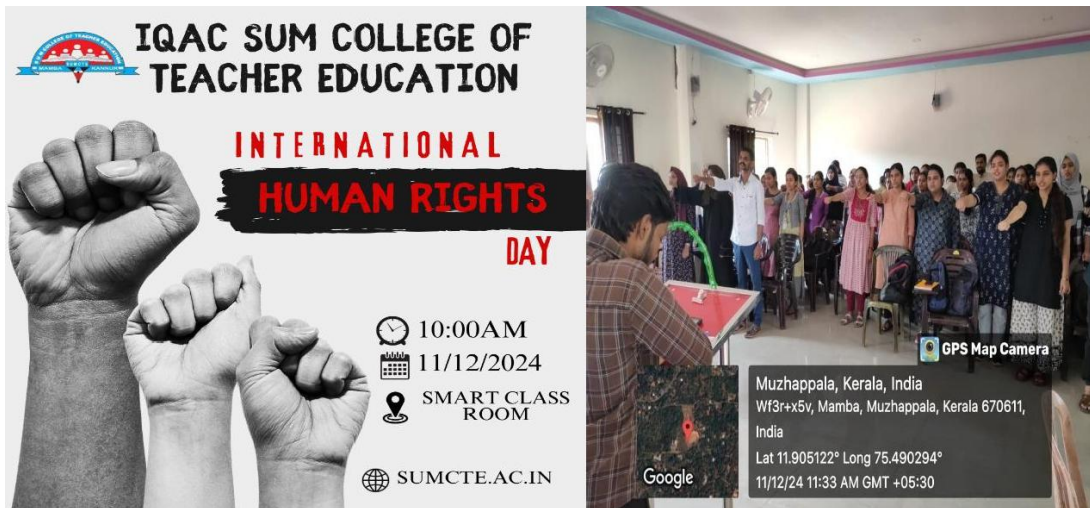


74. International Human rights day

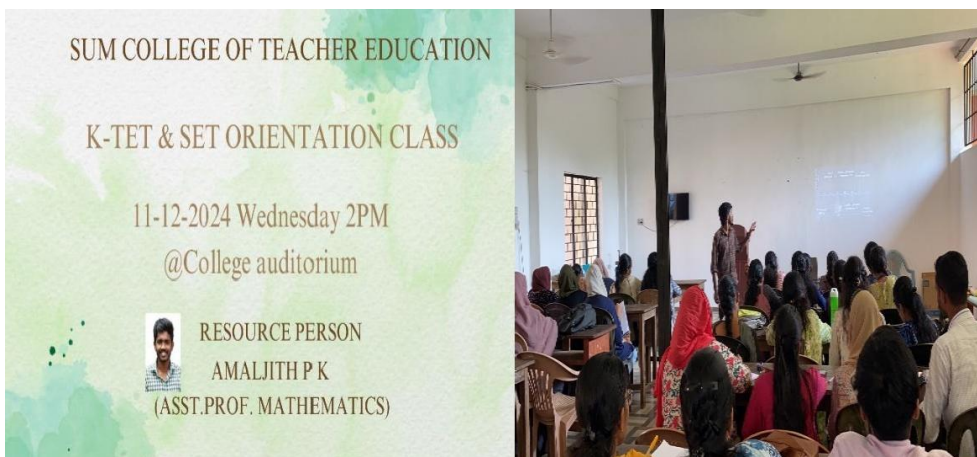


75. K-TET & SET Orientation class- Amaljith P K

78. A search to know local history- field visit- Thalassery fort- Brennen's Tomb-Overbury's folly

Introduction

As part of our curriculum, the Social Science Department organized a field trip to Thalassery to explore the rich local history and heritage of the region. The primary objective of this trip was to gain a practical understanding of historical sites and their significance, thereby connecting classroom knowledge to real-world heritage. Objective of the Field Trip:

St. John's Anglican Church

Our first stop was St. John's Anglican Church, one of the oldest churches in Kerala, built in 1869 during the British colonial period. Guided by Sunil Sir, we learned about its history as a worship center for British officers. The church was funded by Sir Edward Brennan, who, after surviving a shipwreck, oversaw its construction. The church is an example of Anglican and Gothic architecture and was recently renovated with funds from the Departments of

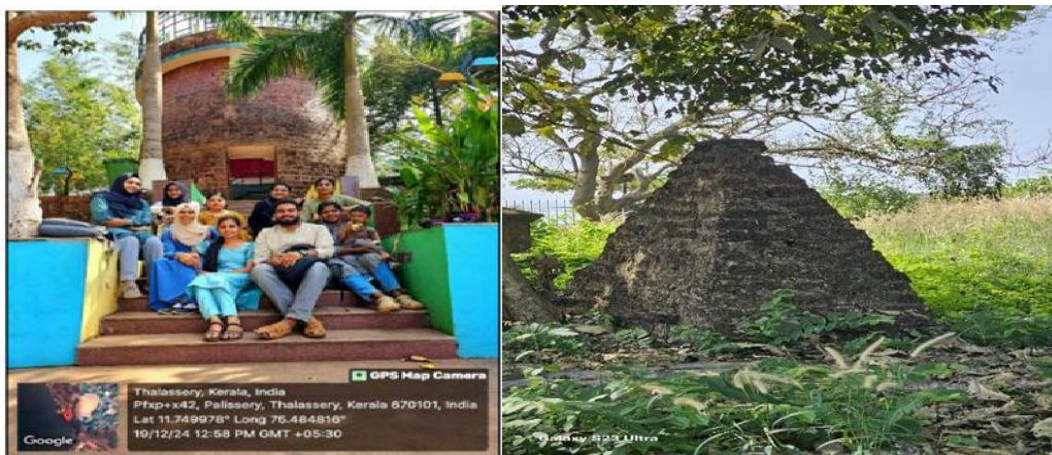
Archaeology and Tourism. The visit highlighted the role of British officials in shaping the local history of Thalassery.

Overbury's Folly

Next, we visited Overbury's Folly, a colonial-era structure built by British judge E.N. Overbury. Intended as a rest house overlooking the Arabian Sea, its construction halted due to Overbury's death or lack of funds. The site, offering panoramic views, is now a popular heritage spot with remnants of colonial architecture. The visit provided insights into Thalassery's colonial past and the significance of preserving such heritage sites.

Thalassery Fort

Our final stop was Thalassery Fort, built in 1708 by the British East India Company. The fort's massive laterite walls, secret tunnels, and ancient cannons reflect the British colonial influence in the region. The site also features a cemetery and lighthouse. The panoramic view of the Arabian Sea and the lush surroundings made the visit both educational and enriching, shedding light on the fort's role in Kerala's history and its strategic importance during colonial times.

Day 6: Villagemukku Beautification and Elderly Care

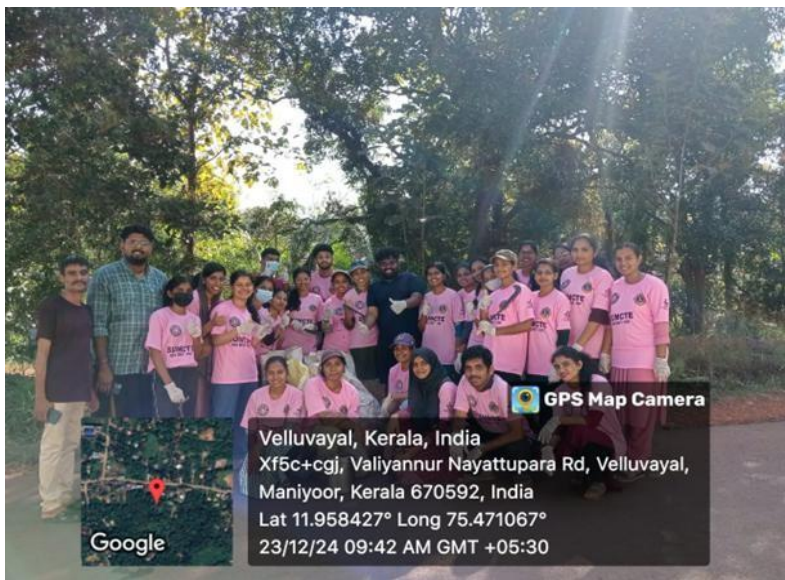

Date: 31/12/2024

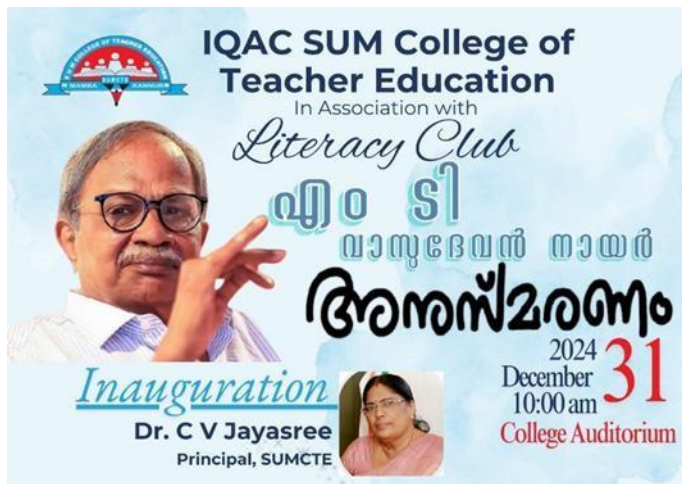
